## What is so Scary About Evangelism. . . And how do you Overcome Those Fears?

Most believers admit that they do not speak to others about Christ with any consistency. When asked the question, "Why don't you?" many will answer in one word,



3. <u>Benefit</u> from experience.

The more you do it, the easier it becomes. Your repertoire of transitions increases.

- 4. As you listen and talk, <u>ask</u> <u>questions</u> that determine if this conversation might be an open door for the gospel.
- 5. Move the conversation from the <u>secular</u>, to the <u>spiritual</u>, to the <u>gospel</u>

## Use questions to move from general topics to the gospel

How is life going for you? Do you have any friends that you consider family? What are your hobbies?	CONVERSATION STARTERS	What is your favorite thing about your job? Where did you grow up? Do you follow any

May I share with you the main message of the Bible?		Could I share with you the most important thing that has happened in my life?

- II. I do not know <u>how</u> to present the gospel.
  - A. What's the problem?
    - 1. You may not have it clear in your mind the message of the gospel and the meaning of "saving faith".
      - a) The message of the gospel is Christ <u>died</u> for our sins and <u>rose</u> from the dead.

For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. **1 Corinthians 15:3-4** 

b) The meaning of saving faith is to <u>trust</u> in Christ alone to save you.

Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me has everlasting life. **John 6:47** NKJV

- 2. You have never learned a <u>method</u>. Anyone consistent in evangelism has a basic method they use.
- B. What's the Solution?
  - Learn the <u>Bad</u> <u>News</u> / <u>Good</u> <u>News</u> approach to presenting the gospel. It has freed up thousands to talk about the Savior with clarity and confidence. (For additional training in sharing the gospel, go to Evantell.org)
- III. I may not be able to answer their <u>questions</u> and <u>objections</u>.
  - A. What's the problem?
    - A failure to understand your <u>biblical</u> responsibility.
      God is not asking you to <u>defend</u> the gospel; He's simply asking you to <u>declare</u> it.

And I, when I came to you, brothers, did not come proclaiming to you the testimony of God with lofty speech or wisdom. For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ and him crucified. **1 Corinthians 2:1-2** 

2. A tendency to forget <u>how</u> people are brought to Christ.

And my speech and my message were not in plausible words of wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power, 5so that your faith might not rest in the wisdom of men but in the power of God. **1 Corinthians 2:4-5** 

- 3. A misunderstanding of <u>why</u> people often ask questions and raise objections.
  - a) They have not received a clear presentation of the gospel.

- b) They are putting up what is commonly referred to as a "smoke screen".
- B. What's the solution?
  - 1. Take the <u>offensive</u>, not the <u>defensive</u>.
  - 2. Kindly ask clarifying <u>questions</u>.
    - a) "What do you mean by that?"
    - b) "How did you come to that conclusion?"
  - 3. Keep the conversation centered on the <u>gospel</u>.
  - 4. Make each situation a <u>learning</u> experience.

**Dawson Trotman** once said, "They may catch me once, but they'll never catch me twice with the same questions."

- 5. If they ask you a question you cannot answer, respond with "Let me <u>think</u> <u>about</u> <u>that</u>."
- 6. Recognize that the root issue is <u>spiritual</u>, not <u>intellectual</u>.

And even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing. 4In their case the god of this world has blinded the minds of the unbelievers, to keep them from seeing the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God. **2 Corinthians 4:3-4**
