The "Farewell Discourse" of Jesus in John 13–17

- Context: The night before Jesus was crucified
- <u>Purpose</u>: To prepare His disciples for His imminent departure
- 2 Main Themes:
 - 1. Love one another
 - 2. Stay faithful

The 3 Stages of Oriental Wedding/Marriage

- 1. The Betrothal (John 14:1-3)
- 2. The Presentation (Jude 24-25)
- 3. The Consummation/Celebration (Revelation 19:7-8; John 2:1-11)

The Return of Jesus Christ (Parousia)

• 2 Stages:

- 1. Rapture of the Church
- 2. Return of Jesus Christ to earth, to judge, reign & rule

- 2. Our hope for His Return motivates us to faithful and diligent service (1 Cor. 15:58; 2 Cor. 5:10).
- 3. Our hope for His Return motivates us to finish our life and ministry well (2 Tim. 4:1-8).
