3 Vital Stages of Sonship of Jesus Christ in the Book of Hebrews

1. Preexistent, Eternal Son

2. Incarnate, Earthly Son

3. Exalted, Heavenly Son

- 6. Christ the Redeemer/Atonement for sin
- 7. Christ the Ruler/Sovereign of all things

 - The path to reward is the path of enduring
- 5. Warning #5 (12:25-29): THE PERIL OF REFUSAL
 - > The path to holiness is the path of discipline

4 Views on the Warning Passages

1. Christians who lose their salvation

- 2. Professing "believers" who abandon their profession
- 3. Hypothetical situation for genuine believers who abandon their faith

4. Christians who are in danger of willfully rejecting Christ by returning to the safe haven of Judaism

8 Reasons for Jesus' Humanity in Hebrews 2:5-18

- 1. To fulfill God's purpose for man (vv. 5-9a)
- 2. To taste death for all (v. 9b)
- 3. To bring many sons to glory (vv. 10-13)
- 4. To destroy the devil (v. 14)
- 5. To deliver those in bondage (v. 15)
- 6. To become a merciful & faithful high priest (vv. 16-17a)
- 7. To make atonement for sins (v. 17b)
- 8. To help those who are being tempted (v. 18)

The Temptations of Jesus (Matt. 4:1-11)

• 3 Observations about Jesus' Temptations:

- 1. They were initiated by God (Holy Spirit).
 - Satan-agent
- 2. They were uniquely for Jesus, the Son of God.
 - Only Jesus would have been temped by them
- 3. They were representative of all men.
 - Temptations that appeal to 3 areas of humanity (1 Jn. 2:15-16)
 - 1) Lust of the flesh
 - 2) Lust of the eyes
 - 3) Pride of life
