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The Seven Churches of Revelation



The 7 Churches of Revelation

- Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadelphia & Laodicea
- They are historic and representative.
 1. The number “seven” is symbolic & representative for John.
 2. The promise to each of the churches at the close of each letter is the exhortation to hear what the Spirit says to “the churches.”
 3. These 7 churches may represent the 7 successive periods of church history.

The 7 Letters to the 7 Churches in Revelation 2–3

- The risen & glorified Christ is the Lord of the Churches and the One who evaluates them.
- The letters follow a common literary format:
 1. A description of the recipient & the Author (Christ)
 2. A commendation of works (except Sardis & Laodicea)
 3. A condemnation or rebuke (except Smyrna & Philadelphia)
 4. An exhortation to specific action
 5. A promise

The Church in Ephesus (2:1-7)

- Christ: Protects & Present in the Church
- Commendation: Zeal for the Truth
- Condemnation: Loveless Orthodoxy
- Exhortation: Repent, Remember, Repeat
- Promise: Eternal Life

The Church in Smyrna (2:8-11)

- **The city of Smyrna:**

- *Approximately 35-40 mi. north of Ephesus*
- *Important seaport city with a large Jewish population*
- *The only surviving city of the 7 churches mentioned, known as the modern Turkey city called Izmir*

- **The church in Smyrna:**

- *No scriptural reference to the founding of a church in Smyrna*
- *Many Christians were executed for refusing emperor worship during Domitian's reign (A.D. 81-96).*
- *The most famous martyr was Polycarp, the Bishop of Smyrna, who was burned alive in A.D. 155.*

The Church in Smyrna (2:8-11) cont.

1. Christ (v. 8)

- *Eternal & Risen*

2. Commendation (v. 9)

- *Their Spiritual Riches*

3. Exhortation (v. 10a)

- *Be Faithful (“Do not be afraid”)*

4. Promise (vv. 10b-11)

- *The crown of life (Eternal Life)*

The Church in Pergamum (2:12-17)

- **The city of Pergamum:**

- *Approximately 45-55 mi. north of Smyrna*
- *It had one of the finest libraries of antiquity*
- *It had the great altar of Zeus*
- *It was the provincial temple of imperial cult worshiping Augustus Caesar*

- **The church in Pergamum:**

- *The city was known for Christian martyrdom*

The Church in Pergamum (2:12-17) cont.

1. Christ (v. 12)

- *Judging with His Word (cf. Heb. 4:12)*

2. Commendation (v. 13)

- *Their faithfulness in the “world” (Satan’s throne)*

3. Condemnation (vv. 14-15)

- *Their religious/moral compromise (minority)*

4. Exhortation (v. 16)

- *Repentance for the erring believers*

5. Promise (v. 17)

- *The hidden manna*
